## IMLS Grant Conference Call—December 15, 2006

- 1. Jim Rettig reported that he submitted the project for the Gabriella Page Historic Preservation Award from the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities; see <u>http://www.apva.org/awards</u>. Winners will be announced on January 30.
- 2. Project status:
  - a. Richmond will continue developing the Web site and will also continue to collect data for the outcomes assessment plan.
  - b. Tufts will use its remaining funds for additional digitization.
- 3. As of December 14, 2006, the balance in our grant was \$43,735.16:

- a. Richmond has identified an appropriate use for \$500 of its remaining funds.
  - i. Chris Kemp will send Tufts the comments submitted in response to the site's questionnaire.

- b. Tufts will use its funds for improvements based on user suggestions.
- c. Greg Crane raised a question about the project's relationship to the VCDH and would like to get a sense of what incoming president Ayers would like. Jim Gwin said he would convey this to Bob Kenzer before Prof. Kenzer's lunch meeting with Prof. Ayers.
- 4. Rachel Frick raised questions about additional uses of the Tufts names authority file. Virginia Commonwealth University's hospital has antecedents in the hospital run by Sally Tompkins. VCU is doing a project to list patients admitted and discharged. How can the authority file help link the VCU records and the newspaper records. Greg Crane recommended an alternative approach.
- 5. Chris Kemp gave Tufts a gentle reminder about returning hard drives.
